IN RE: ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER:  
AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE PLAN  
FOR THE ASSIGNMENT OF CASES

Whereas the Arkansas Supreme Court delivered an opinion on January 22, 2004, regarding Administrative Order Number 14 in which it added domestic relations cases to criminal and juvenile cases as cases which can be exclusively assigned to particular judges in the various judicial districts of Arkansas; and

Whereas the circuit judges of the twelfth judicial district submitted a modified case assignment plan to the Arkansas Supreme Court on January 28, 2004, providing for the exclusive assignment of domestic relations cases which was approved by the Arkansas Supreme Court on March 24, 2004; and

Whereas it is the desire of the circuit judges in the twelfth judicial district to have the Sebastian County Circuit Clerk assign cases to the various circuit judges in the district according to the modified plan;

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that commencing January 1, 2009 the Sebastian County Circuit Clerk (hereinafter circuit clerk) shall randomly assign cases to the various divisions as set out below, and shall randomly reassign to the various divisions all pending cases filed since January 1, 2004, as set out below unless a judge to whom an individual case has been assigned directs that the case not be reassigned:

Division I (Judge Stephen Tabor): Thirty-three percent of criminal cases, fifty percent of drug court cases, and thirty-three percent of civil cases.

Division II (Judge Harry Foltz): Fifty percent of the domestic relations cases and forty-five percent of probate cases.


Division III (Judge Jim Spears): Fifty percent of the domestic relations cases and forty-five percent of probate cases.

Division IV (Judge Mark Hewett): One hundred percent of juvenile cases.


Division V (Judge J. Michael Fitzhugh): Thirty-three percent of the criminal cases, fifty percent of drug court cases, and thirty-three percent of civil cases.

Division VI (Judge James O. Cox): Thirty-four percent of criminal cases other than drug court cases, thirty-four percent of civil cases, and 10 percent of probate cases.




