BASIC Mediation Training

The Arkansas Alternative Dispute Resolution Commission is pleased to present a **40 Hour Basic Mediation Training Course**.

The course will be held July 14 through 18, 2014 in Little Rock, location to be announced. **Barbara Hulburt**, of the McCammon Group, Richmond, Virginia will serve as Trainer. Tuition for the course is \$850.00, which covers course registration, training materials, and lunch. The registration deadline is June 27, 2014.

The course is designed to introduce participants to mediation as an alternative way to resolve conflicts. Skills used in the mediation process are taught through lecture, discussion, and role play. The goal of the course is to provide participants with the knowledge and skills needed to be an effective mediator.

Barbara Hulburt is a facilitator, mediator, trainer, and organizational consultant. She has been active in the field of dispute resolution since 1988. Currently Facilitator and Training Director of the McCammon Group in Richmond, Virginia, she is an attorney by training and worked for the Supreme Court of Virginia as the first Director of Dispute Resolution Services. In addition to mediation training, she has done extensive training in communication, teamwork, negotiation, conflict management, leadership, coaching, and critical thinking skills. She has served as a facilitator of consensus building with a wide variety of groups working on topics ranging from public policy debates to strategic planning.

FAMILY Mediation Training

PREREQUISITE for this Course:
Commission approved BASIC MEDIATION TRAINING.

The Arkansas Alternative Dispute Resolution Commission will present a **20 Hour Family Mediation Training Course**, October 8 through 10, 2014 at the Justice Building in Little Rock. Tuition for the course is \$550.00, which includes registration fees, training materials, and lunch. The registration deadline is September 19, 2014.

The Family Mediation Training provides a comprehensive grounding in the elements of divorce mediation with instructor **Kathey Foskett**, of Northern Virginia Mediation Services. Participants build on prior training and experience in general mediation to develop the skills and knowledge necessary for the mediation of property division, custody, and visitation & support issues occurring in the divorce process.

Kathey Foskett is a senior mediator, facilitator, trainer and consultant with the Northern Virginia Mediation Service (NVMS). She is a Virginia Supreme Court certified mentor mediator with an Advanced Certificate. Kathey has earned a Master of Science Degree in Counseling from Western Connecticut State University. She is a member of the Virginia Mediation Network and the Association for Conflict Resolution. Kathey has designed and conducted over one thousand hours of training for professionals in the areas of Mediation, Conflict Management and Resolution and related skills.

The **BASIC MEDIATION TRAINING** or a Commission approved Basic Mediation Training taken within the last five years is a **PREREQUISITE** for taking the **FAMILY MEDIATION TRAINING**.

Both courses comply with the training standards set forth by the Arkansas Alternative Dispute Resolution Commission.

Participants who complete the Basic Mediation Training are not automatically certified by the Arkansas ADR Commission.

Certification is achieved only by successfully completing the certification application process, which includes meeting education, training, practical experience, and ethical standards.
