ORDER OF SUSPENSION ON RECIPROCAL DISCIPLINE ACTION

On September 21, 2012, Panel A considered the Complaint & Notice of Reciprocal Discipline Action filed against Respondent Margaret Ingle, AR Bar #2011287, of Austin, Texas, and finds:

1. By letter dated June 1, 2012, and received and filed with the Committee on June 4, 2012, Ms. Ingle self-reported to the Committee that she had been disciplined by an Agreed Judgment of Partially Probated Suspension in a disciplinary case in Texas, where she is licensed with Texas Bar Card No. 24050805.

2. By letter dated July 19, 2012, and received and filed July 23, 2012, the Office of the Chief Disciplinary Counsel for the State Bar of Texas provided a certified copy of the Agreed Judgment of Partially Probated Suspension in Case No. A0041113710, Commission for Lawyer Discipline vs. Margaret A.H. Ingle, before the District 9 Grievance Committee Evidentiary Panel 9-3, State Bar of Texas, filed April 23, 2012.

3. By the Texas settlement order, Ms. Ingle agreed to a suspension of her Texas law license for four (4) years, with one month to be active suspension and the remaining time probated suspension on conditions. The active suspension was to commence on June 1, 2012.

4. This Complaint was filed July 24, 2012.
5. The Complaint was served on Ms. Ingle on July 27, 2012.
6. The due date for a timely response was twenty (20) days later, or August 16, 2012.
7. Ms. Ingle failed to file a timely Response or obtain an extension of time within which to file.
8. Panel A finds that the requirements in Section 14 of the Arkansas Procedures for imposing a reciprocal sanction to that imposed by Texas are met.
9. An “active” suspension of Ms. Ingle’s Arkansas law license for one (1) month shall be imposed, to commence with the date this order becomes final and is filed with the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Arkansas.
10. Upon the commencement of her Arkansas suspension, Ms. Ingle shall comply with the requirements of Sections 21 and 22 of the Arkansas Procedures regarding “former,” or suspended, attorneys.

IT IS ORDERED by Panel A that the Arkansas law license of Respondent Margaret Ingle, AR Bar #2011287, be, and it hereby is, suspended for a period of one (1) month from the date this Order is filed with the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Arkansas, and that after serving her suspension, Ms. Ingle may petition the Committee for reinstatement to good standing as provided in Section 23 of the Arkansas Procedures.
